WIND TURBINE BLOWS OUT

In December 2012, FCC Environment applied to erect a 90 metre wind turbine at the Landfill site which is directly next to Newton Leys. The application was rejected by Milton Keynes Council in December 2012 mainly due to the impact on Newton Leys.

FCC appealed the matter to the Secretary of State of Communities & Local Government who appointed a planning inspector to consider the appeal.

Following an online consultation survey with local residents, Newton Leys Residents Association submitted a robust response detailing health, ecology and nature issues as well as the failure of the developer to engage with the community of Newton Leys.

The Planning Inspector sided with local residents stating 'I am not satisfied that the planning impacts identified by the affected local community have been addressed by the developers'.

NLRA were supported by Stop Salden Turbine group and both Newton Longville Parish Council and Drayton Parslow Parish Council also objected. For more info, please visit nlinfo.uk/windappeal



NEWTON LEYS SHOPS GETS THE GO AHEAD!



Earlier this year, Milton Keynes Council considered the application from HDD and ASDA to open a local shopping centre for Newton Leys on the site adjacent between Arran Way, Jersey Drive and Skew Bridge.

The local centre will contain an ASDA supermarket with Click&Collect facilities, a parade of six retail units, an older persons care home, day nursery, and a public house/restaurant. We've heard that a fish & chip shop and ZigZag Hair Studios based in Kingston & Westcroft have also taken up units. Central to the shopping facilities will be a local square which will be a focal point for the community to gather and hold events.

At the Council meeting where the planning permission was decided there were some concerns about the change in location from the future phase 5 to the proposed site which is more visible, and also that the road will increase traffic in Newton Longville. The Chair of Newton Leys Residents Association spoke in favour of the development which was approved by a narrow majority. We look forward to ASDA opening next summer. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH AT NEWTON LEYS

The latest quarterly crime figures Nov-May show 20 crimes reported in Newton Leys as opposed to 1718 in Bletchley (1.16% of Bletchley Crime). When this figure is compared against the rest of Milton Keynes it is virtually non-existent being 0.16% of all of the crime in MK for the same period (12642 crimes).

We are lucky to live in such a crime free area. But let's not be complacent. Our Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator Ben Dimmock has just launched a new community app to spark the whole community into action to help prevent crime and antisocial behaviour, and able to alert one another to suspicious activities. PLAY AREA UPDATE

At the time that we went to press, the first play area within the Milton Keynes part of the development was having the finishing touches applied, ready for the Milton Keynes Council team to sign it off. Once signed off by the Council, the site will open pretty much immediately.

There will be a further 4 play areas to open with 1 being within Aylesbury Vale and 3 within MK. The main Neighbourhood (or large park) will be located adjacent to Willow Lake - near the existing show homes. Remaining play areas will be in Phase 5 (2019) Phase 7 (2021) and The Gateway site - the empty fields between Community Centre and Bovis (2024).

GET YOUR WATER DISCOUNT!

The lakes around the site are not just there to look pretty, and provide us with nature and wildlife, they are part of a sustainable urban drainage system (SUDS).

Surface water does not drain from your property into the sewer, but drains into the the network of lakes and pond around the development. They are designed to hold large amounts of water in the event of a flood, thereby reducing the impact of potential flooding on our properties and the local area.

Check the your water bill now. If you are billed for 'Foul Only' under the sewage section - you receive a discount. If it says 'Foul and Surface' you need to call Anglian Water on 03457 91 91 55 and ask them to apply your surface water discount because your are connected to a SUDS system.
